### **HIGHLIGHTS**

#### **RECRUITMENT TRENDS**

68% of employers plan to recruit more foreign nationals in the next five years, with the UK (63%), Germany (39%) and France (33%) being the most important markets.

#### **IN-DEMAND SKILLS**

The competitive landscape for talent acquisition is particularly pronounced in France and the UK:

#### UK:

- IT backgrounds: 44%
- Human resources and talent acquisition: 41%
- Engineering and technical experience: 38%

#### France:

- IT backgrounds: 59%
- Engineering and technical skills: 52%
- Finance and accounting expertise: 47%

#### **VISA CHALLENGES**

For companies looking to utilize business visas, visa procedures present several obstacles, including:

- · Obtaining necessary documentation (55%)
- Managing varying processing timelines (53%)
- Coordinating multiple visa applications (52%)

#### **POLICY CHANGE**

Despite changing immigration policies, employers remain optimistic. For instance:

- 65% of UK employers believe the increased minimum salary threshold for skilled workers will lead to more sponsored employees
- 80% of UK employers expect the new immigration salary list to address specific field needs
