# FACTSHEET: GLOBAL BUSINESS MOBILITY ROUTE

### **ABOUT THIS GUIDE**

On 11 April 2022, applications opened for the UK's Global Business Mobility (GBM) route. This 'umbrella category' is for overseas businesses who need to temporarily send workers to the UK for a specific purpose that cannot be done by a settled worker. From 11 April, the GBM routes replace and update several pre-existing visa categories.

Below is an overview of the 5 Global Business Mobility routes designed for different assignment types. Please click the hyperlinks for more information on each category.

### THE 5 GLOBAL BUSINESS MOBILITY ROUTES

- <u>Senior or Specialist Worker</u> For senior managers or specialist employees who are being assigned by their overseas employer to a linked UK business. This route has replaced the Intra-Company Transfer (ICT) route.
- Graduate Trainee For employees of an overseas business who are on a graduate training
  programme leading to a senior management or specialist position and are required to do a work
  placement with a linked UK business. This route has replaced the Intra-Company Graduate Trainee
  route.
- <u>UK Expansion Worker</u> For senior managers or specialist employees of an overseas business
  who are being assigned to the UK to establish a UK branch or subsidiary of the overseas business.
  This route has replaced the sole representative provisions of the Representative of an Overseas
  Business route.
- Service Supplier For contractual service suppliers employed by an overseas business or selfemployed independent professionals based overseas who are being assigned to the UK to provide services covered by one of the UK's international trade agreements. This route has replaced the provisions for contractual service suppliers and independent professionals on the International Agreement route.
- Secondment Worker For employees of an overseas business who have been seconded to the UK as part of a high value contract or investment. This is a new route under the points-based immigration system and therefore has no equivalent predecessor.
